

Sacred Heart Key Stage 3 Uniform & Equipment List PLEASE MARK ALL ITEMS OF UNIFORM WITH STUDENT'S NAME

PLEASE NOTE: We expect full school uniform to be worn whilst travelling to/from school everyday

Uniform:

Kilt A kilt in our school tartan is available from the school outlet. It must be worn no

shorter than knee length.

Trousers Trousers in our school tartan are also available from the school outlet as an

alternative to the kilt.

Jacket Blue blazer with school logo on pocket is available from the school outlet.

Blouse White shirt with an open neck collar, not a polo shirt.

Sweater V-neck navy sleeveless pullover with school logo is available from the school outlet,

the same pullover is also available with sleeves.

Shoes Plain black, sensible school shoes, (no high heels for safety reasons). No boots,

trainers, canvas shoes or sling backs are allowed. A boot is footwear that comes

above the ankle bone.

Socks/Tights Black or white plain socks or plain black tights.

Coat Preferably black or navy blue of a style in keeping with school uniform and which fits

over the school jacket. Leather, denim, suede and sheepskin are NOT suitable for

school wear and can be a security risk.

P.E. Uniform See separate letter from Miss Peach, our Head of PE.

Jewellery A watch may be worn providing it is not a 'smart watch' e.g. Apple Watch. No other

jewellery may be worn at all. This includes ear or nose studs or any piercings.

Hair must be tied back for health and safety reasons. Hair plaited with beads, poses

a health and safety hazard and is therefore not permitted. Unnatural

colouring/streaking of hair and/or hair extensions are not permitted.

Make-up Make-up may not be worn – this includes nail varnish, false nails, eyelash extensions

and fake tan.

Recommended Equipment:

General Students must provide themselves with a pen for writing, a pencil, a ruler, a rubber

and coloured pencils, all of which should be kept in a pencil case.

English Pen (Black or Blue), pencil, highlighter, ruler, coloured pencils, and dictionary.

Mathematics Protractor or angle measures, pair of compasses, 30cm ruler. All students will require

a non-programmable scientific calculator, the department suggests a Casio.

Calculators can be purchased from the Maths department for £5.50.

Modern Languages Dictionary (French or Spanish), advice will be given by staff in September.
